James J. Weideman, age 87, of Howard, Ohio, entered into rest, Wednesday, August 13, 2014 at his residence following a long illness.

He was born in Kent, OH. on December 7, 1926 to Roman J. and Florence (Hutchison) Weideman.

He served in the U.S. Army during WWII.

In 1935 as a young man, he moved from Wadsworth to Wayne County and lived in the Smithville and then Wooster area for most of his life. He married Wanda E. Craft on June 24, 1947 in Clinton, MD. She entered into rest in 1998.

He started working for Nickle Plate RR for many years. James then worked as a Cabinet Maker for both the Green Steel Co. in PA. along with Ruhlin Construction Co. in Akron for 23 years before retiring in 1988.

He was a member of the Catholic Church; the Akron Local #639 Carpenters Union; enjoyed playing cards and camping with family and friends and following retirement, enjoyed carpentry and woodworking.
