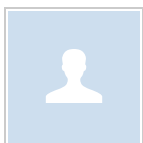

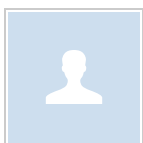

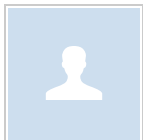
“ Dear Gale, Kent, Marshall and Rena,
